

Wondering what being a member of the Lakewood Co-op Preschool community is like?

Read below to learn more about working in the classroom, supporting the operations of the Co-op through a school job, required meetings, costs, and scholarships. More detailed information is available on the Lakewood Cooperative Preschool website and in the Handbook.

Working in the classroom

Parents and designated caregivers for each enrolled student serve as assistant teachers in the classroom. Depending on class size, parents and caregivers typically work two to four times a month in the classroom. Assistant teacher positions include floaters, who provide support to the teacher in the classroom; art, who oversees art projects/activities for the day; and the snack lead, who brings in and serves snack and oversees activities in the kitchen area.

School Jobs

Lakewood Co-op is run by family volunteers. Each family is responsible for performing one job throughout the school year. Jobs vary in their complexity and time commitments, with most jobs running two to four hours per month while others run considerably more. There are Board positions (e.g., co-chair, secretary, enrollment lead, anti-bias committee lead) and classroom support positions (e.g., supplies manager, laundry support, fundraising, webmaster).

Monthly Meetings

All Lakewood Co-op families are required to attend the following meetings, where we learn more about co-op events and requirements, what's happening in our classes, parent and child development, and gain valuable insights from other caregivers.

School Set-up/Deep Clean/Breakdown

All Lakewood Co-op families are required to take part in one of the following: beginning of year classroom set-up, midyear classroom deep clean or end of year classroom breakdown. A fine of \$150 is levied for nonparticipation.
